



Governors' Statement of Behaviour Principles

This statement sets out the values, beliefs and principles the Governing Body expect all school policies to reflect with particular reference to the Behaviour Policy.

The governors wish the school to promote:

- The principles of Trauma Perceptive Practice
 - Hope not hopelessness
 - Compassion instead of blame
 - Connection not disconnection
- The school motto "Enjoy, Respect, Achieve."
- Respect for self and others
- An environment with clear expectations of behaviour and well communicated routines which are implemented in a predictable and consistent manner
- An approach to behaviour which is mindful of individuals, recognising that undesirable behaviour may be a communication of an educational need, mental health vulnerability or other need
- A positive approach which maintains personal dignity and promotes integrity and trust
- The school's learning behaviours
- A partnership with parents/carers

The production and implementation of the Behaviour Policy is the responsibility of the Headteacher, with the support of the governors.
