



Superheroes



Welcome to Year One!

Welcome back from the Year One team – Mrs Haley, Miss Paul, Mrs McTaggart and Mrs Potter.

To help the children move smoothly from Reception to Year 1 and back into the routines of school, the first half term will be a gradual lead into the National Curriculum. Our topic this half term is 'Superheroes.' We will be encouraging the children to be independent learners who make their own choices - our main aim is that they enjoy their time back at school, and enjoy learning.



English Phonics and Reading – the children will continue to have 5 phonic lessons each week. They will be building on the sounds already learnt in Reception. During the 1st half term they will learn these graphemes - /ai/ ay play, /ow/ ou cloud, /oi/ oy toy, /ea/ ea each. They will also learn to read these tricky words – the, put, pull, full, push, to, into, I, no, go, of, he, she, we, me, be, was, you, they, all, are, my, by, sure, pure, said, have, like, so, do, some, come, love, were, there, little, one, when, out, what, says, here and today.

The children will have 3 practice reading sessions a week. They will be reading fully decodable books which have been carefully matched to their knowledge of phonics. The books they bring home will have been chosen by them to share and enjoy with you. **They are not intended for your child to read to you independently.** Please refer to your child's Sharing Record for more detail.

English writing - we will teach the children to write in a range of genres that includes lists, stories, invitations and letters. They will develop their understanding of sentence structure and improve their letter formation. They will use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

Maths - practical activities will be used to improve counting and number recognition to 20. We will also be focusing on knowing our number bonds within 10 confidently and working out addition and subtraction problems using objects, number lines and drawing pictures. The children will also be measuring and comparing the length of objects.

Computing - as well as learning how to keep themselves safe online, the children learn how to turn on the computers and log on. They will begin to learn how to type and understand how the keyboard of a computer works. **RE** - we will think about the importance of friendships and what makes us special. We will learn about special people from the Bible and listen to stories that explain why they are special.

Art - this term we will be learning about colour mixing. We will investigate how to mix primary colours to produce secondary colours. We will also explore how to make colours lighter and darker and then use this to design our very own 'Superhero' costume.

PE – the children will be learning to throw and catch accurately and will use these skills in simple games. In dance they will create sequences using different actions and movements.

Geography - we will be focusing on the weather and how this varies throughout the seasons. The children will make observations and record information about the weather in autumn and winter. They will be encouraged to observe how sunrise and sunset change over the course of the year to help them discover that the hours of sunlight are longest in the summer and shortest in the winter.

Science – the children will be identifying and labelling parts of the human body and saying which part of the body is associated with each sense. We will use our developing understanding to write about our superheroes, describing which superpowers they have based on the five senses, for example, being able to smell danger.

A Toy's Life

English - we will learn about fiction and non-fiction books. Using their knowledge of non-fiction books, the children will find interesting information about toys from the past, such as spinning tops, a Jack in the Box and wooden rocking horses. They will also investigate how toys they may have - such as teddies and dolls - have changed over time by looking at artefacts and photographs.

Maths - we will continue to build on numeracy skills, such as accurate counting and halving and doubling of numbers and through problem solving e.g. There are 13 toys in a toy shop, a child comes along and purchases 2 toys, how many are left? Can you write a number sentence?

In the second half term, we will have a visit from 'History Off the Page' who will create a toy museum in school. This interesting and exciting day will support our stimulating cross curricular topic, 'A Toy's Life'. The hands-on day will give the children the opportunity to explore a variety of toys from the past, see how toys have changed and make comparisons to the toys they play with today.

Music – the children will be singing songs linked to their senses and body parts. They will begin to understand what pitch, timbre and duration are and will explore this through untuned instruments.

Life skills – during the term the children will focus on understanding and recognising different feelings. This will include learning about the 'zones of regulation' and how this can help them manage and identify their own feelings.



Useful information

- Encouraging your child to prepare for school each day by dressing themselves really helps the children develop a more independent attitude towards school and learning – perhaps use a checklist to help them. Year 1 pupils are expected to take responsibility for handing in their sharing books and record on a Monday as well as any letters from home.
- Your child will choose 2 books on a Monday and keep them at home all week to share with you. Sharing and talking about books helps your child to understand words and sentences. It helps to develop their vocabulary and develop listening and comprehension skills.
- PE will be every Wednesday and Friday. Please ensure you send your child to school in their PE kit on those days. We do Outdoor PE throughout the year, so an outdoor kit will need to be worn as the weather gets colder. Please look at uniform policy for details.
- We will have a visit from the toy museum on Friday 18th November and we are planning a trip to Hyde Hall in the summer term. The overall cost for trips, swimming lessons and other exciting learning opportunities in school is approximately £60. This is only a rough guideline but we hope this information helps your planning.
