One of the most important ways to help support your child is hearing them read regularly and reading to them. The best approach is little and often, just 10 minutes each day makes a difference.



#### English

Throughout the term the children will be developing their reading, writing and spelling skills by learning how to use commas, adjectives, adverbs and apostrophes. They will extend their sentences using the words when, if, but and or. We will be using a range of books to inspire our descriptive writing. The books Handa's Surprise, The Ugly Five and A Kenyan Child will help us develop story writing skills. We will also be looking at instructions and recounts.

# Design & Technology


This term we will be making hand puppets. The children will be making the characters – from Handa's Surprise – and hopefully using our puppets to tell the stories later in the year. As part of the design process they will investigate the different ways they can join a variety of materials and they will have the opportunity to practise their sewing skills.

#### Art

In art we will be making a sculpture of a Kenyan mask out of papier mache. We will be using our colour mixing skills from Year I to add detail by painting our masks.

#### Computing

During our computing lessons the children will learn how to research information safely online. They will be using Google to find answers to specific questions about Kenya. They will also learn how to save, retrieve and edit a document.



#### Science

In the first half term the children will be learning about habitats in hot and cold places. They will also create simple food chains. Later in the term the children will be studying micro habitats, for example a pile of leaves or under a log.

#### Maths

Over the term, the children will continue to work on their understanding of place value and their calculation skills. They will practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. They will continue to learn the 5 and 10 times tables and related division facts to help them solve a variety of problems in different contexts. We will also be looking at fractions of numbers and of shapes including halves, thirds and quarters. We will continue to practise reading 5 minute time.

### P.E.

In outdoor P.E. the children will continue to develop their skills through a variety of games involving attacking, defending and scoring. We will creating our own gymnastic sequences and work to improve our rolls and balances.

## Spelling

Spelling sessions continue daily and are a key element in Year Two. The children will be learning which graphemes to choose, and begin to look at some of the rules of spelling. Any reading at home will also help support your child with spelling. It will help them to become familiar with spelling patters that they have looked at, and enable to them to 'see' when words look correct.and improve word recognition.

#### Geography

This term the children will be learning about the locations of the equator, the seven continents and the five oceans. They will be comparing human and physical features of Nairobi and London and a Kenyan village and Great Totham.

# R.E.

We will look at how Christians live their lives according to their belief in God and Jesus, and learn the Lord's prayer and its meaning. We will also look at the different ways they show commitment to the Christian faith.
