

History

Our topic in the second half of this term is called 'Fire, Fire!' and we will be learning about The Great Fire of London in 1666. We will look at how the fire spread and how London was rebuilt.



PE

Our PE lessons are on Wednesdays and Fridays this term.

In indoor PE, the children will be shown a variety of country dance moves, and work towards performing their own dance.

During gymnastics, the children will be developing their rolls, jumps, balances and ways of travelling. They will then link three of these actions to produce a sequence.



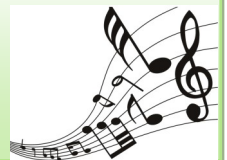
As part of our topic on The Great Fire of London, the children will develop their understanding of fiction and non-fiction texts. The children will learn to write recounts and diaries. They will be learning to recognise questions within a text and demonstrate this in their own writing.

Life Skills

In life skills, the children will be learning to recognise what a 'choice' is and identify how their choices make them feel. They will be learning about maintaining a healthy lifestyles, and how to take care of themselves. Alongside this, they will learn how to keep themselves safe in a range of situations, such as staying safe at home, safety around medicines and knowing how to recognise safe adults.

Poetry and Music

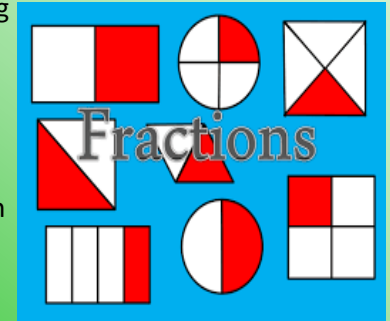
During our music lessons, the children will learn about the interrelated dimensions of music, such as pulse, rhythm and pitch. Using this knowledge, the children will compose their own verse of the poem 'London's Burning', which we will be learning and reciting as part of our poetry unit. The children will experiment with a range of tuned and untuned instruments to support their final composition.



Maths

In maths during the second half of the term, the children will be sharing and grouping different amounts. They will use a range of equipment to support their understanding, including counters and multilink.

Later in the term, the children will be introduced to simple fractions. They will learn to recognise halves and quarters of simple shapes and objects.



Computing

The children will use the program 'Jamboard'. They will learn how to change the pen colour to suit the purpose of the image. They will produce a scene of the Great Fire of London.

Religious Education

The children will learn all about 'special places' and relate this to places in their own lives. They will then learn about special places which are associated with different religions, including mosques and churches.
